

## **Social Management (M.A.)**

### a) Extending knowledge

Students graduating from this course have acquired practical knowledge from the field of social management, which encompasses, in particular, the specific conditions relating to organisations involved in social work. They are able to deal with structural and organisational management tasks within social work institutions.

### b) Intensifying knowledge

Students graduating from this course possess management skills and knowledge from the fields of social sciences, management and law, which qualify them to perform management functions in social institutions or which provide them with additional and more advanced skills for successfully dealing with tasks relating to their existing professional management roles.

### c) Developing working knowledge and skills

#### aa) Analytical knowledge and skills

Students graduating from this course are qualified to analyse procedures and problems relating to conceptual, organisational and financial practice within social institutions, to develop economic and social work solutions and to consider factors from other disciplines. They possess analytical and organisational skills and are able to apply this knowledge and systematically address new academic problems using this knowledge.

#### bb) Systematic knowledge and skills

Students graduating from this course are qualified to analyse and develop interdisciplinary scenarios. The interdisciplinary course enables them to demonstrate social science, management and legal skills and to apply these in dealing with management problems in social work institutions. They are able to think and act in an interdisciplinary and systematic manner.

#### cc) Communicative knowledge and skills

Students graduating from this course are able to take on management responsibilities in social work institutions. They are able to manage projects independently, taking into consideration sociological, economic and legal factors and to produce solutions to problems. They are able to present and explain academic situations to others including non-academics. They are able to present and explain results orally or in writing.
