

Social Work and Education (B.A.)

This degree programme qualifies graduates for scientifically based and practically oriented professional social work and education, including social pedagogical fields.

The programme will enable students to learn and deploy applicant relevant theories and methods in order to assess social and individual problems and to develop/design professional solutions and deliver effective social aid (services).

In so doing, the degree programme provides skills and competences based on scientific references related to various social fields and user groups. In detail: psycho-social aid (case management), counselling, crisis intervention and rehabilitation; design and implementation of services according to current policies; community work, project and quality management; managing social organisations and services.

The degree programme consists of 22 compulsory modules, including the final examination: 10 modules are allocated to the fundamental theoretical knowledge from the following disciplines: sociology, theory of social work; psychology, psychiatry and social psychology; education and pedagogy (general and special needs); ethics; politics; law; business, administration and social management. 8 modules aim to provide the students with practical skills and methodological competences: communication, counselling, dealing with conflicts, social intervention, case management, work with young and older people, media education, and basics of social management.

A further 2 modules advance key abilities (learning strategies, self-directed learning; social competences). 1 module is allocated to social research. Module no. 22 contains the Bachelor's thesis and a viva voce.
