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Issue | starting point | motivation

- **Structurally weak regions** due to (ongoing) economic structural change
- multiple, **'grand' societal challenges**,
such as climate and energy crises, but also urban shrinkage, brain drain or deteriorating physical and cultural infrastructure due to structural change
- Necessary to find **ways for** regional **viability** and multi-layered **resilience**,
such as regional, group-related or individual resilience

How can **resonance relationships** be strengthened in **regional innovation systems (RIS)**, especially with regard to **social innovation (SI)** and **corporate regional responsibility (CRR)**?

And what **effects** does this have **on regional resilience**?

Resonance

- **sociological interpretation of our western modern form of society** always in view of the question which social dynamics promote or inhibit possibilities of a good life
- reply to the **“social acceleration”** (Rosa 2013): describes challenges of **dynamic stabilization** and **alienation**
- **reciprocal and alive relationships** with **other actors**, the **spatial environment** and **activities/actions**
- guiding ideas: **world-relationship formed by affectation and emotion**, **intrinsic interest** and **self-efficacy expectation**

Social innovations in RIS

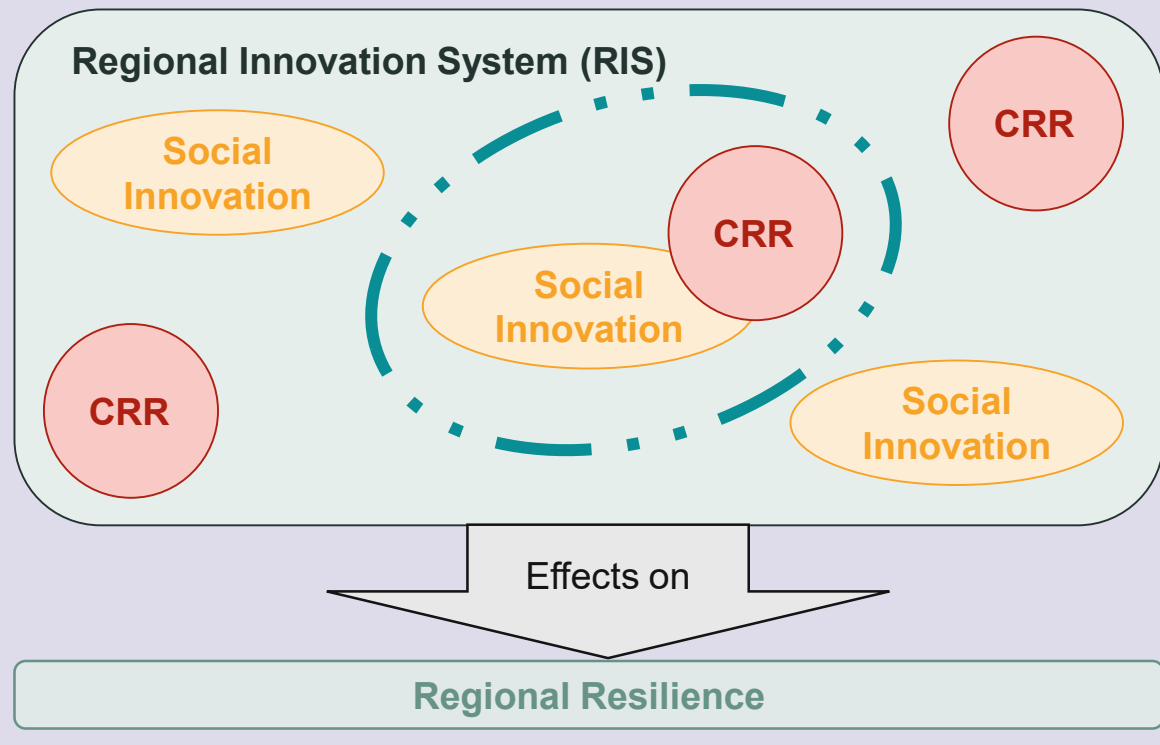
- are **new, often cross-sectoral forms of cooperation** at the individual or organizational level that **develop new** - in the sense of de facto new or adapted for the first time in their respective context - **ideas** on how to satisfy local or regional, socially relevant needs **and implement them**
- increase the actors' ability to shape their environment
- have the potential to contribute to solving societal challenges in the long term

Corporate Regional Responsibility (CRR)

- Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) as the **voluntary assumption of social responsibility** by (mainly, but not only economically operating) organizations with the overarching goal of economic, environmental and social sustainability (...).
- **Corporate Regional Responsibility (CRR)** is defined as the **totality of CSR measures at and around company sites**, with the potential to influence urban and regional development and contribute to solving societal challenges at the regional level.

Regional resilience

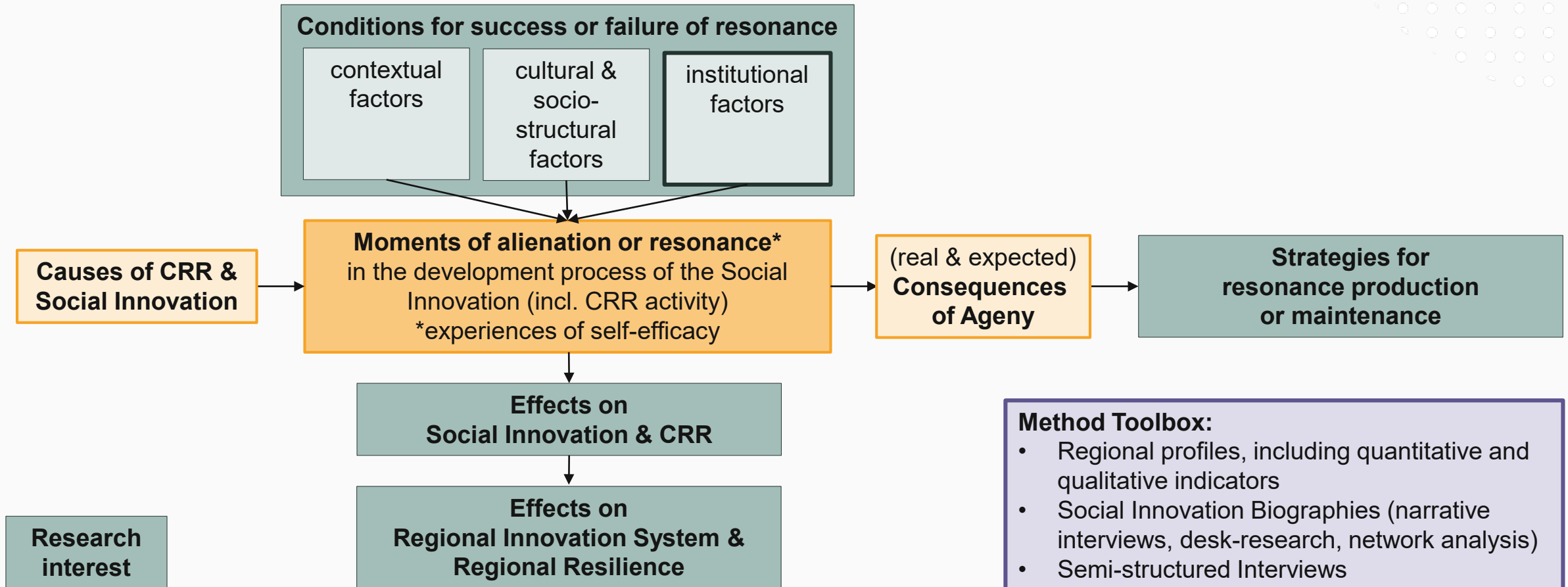
- broadly referring to different resilience elements on the micro-, meso- and/or macro-level that have a direct or indirect spatial dimension
