

How to reference a journal article

The six points of a journal reference

- 1 The **author(s)** in the order they are given in the article. Family name (surname) first, followed by their initial(s)
- 2 The **year** the article was published (in brackets)
- 3 The **full title** of the article
- 4 The **title of the journal** in italics
- 5 The **volume** and **issue** number (where given)
- 6 The **pages** of the article
