

Funding rates for ERASMUS+ scholarships for stays abroad in the 2024/2025 funding period

The rates are determined according to country groups categorised by the EU Commission and according to the Erasmus Call (contract), which is determined by the university.

The funding year may differ from the academic year

Internships (will be financed from Call 2023 until the end of 2024)!	Surcharge for all countries	approx. 5 €/day 150 € per month (commercial running)
Blended Mobility	Standard rate for all countries	79 €/day From call 2023

*1 month = 30 days

The minimum funding period for internships and study visits is 2 months (60 days). For short-term stays 5 days.

Sustainable travel is supported with travel days between 1-2 days (without FO*) and 1-6 days (with FO*). Long-term stays in Germany are not funded with travel allowances according to distance, as the maximum funding rates have been set (see DAAD opt-out). Payment is made at the end of the stay.

Participants with fewer opportunities* (Fewer Opportunities) can apply for a top-up of €250/month. For short-term stays, the top-up is calculated as follows: Stays up to 14 days = €100 one-off payment
Stays of 15 days or more = € 150 one-off payment
Travel allowance according to distance = one-off payment

70% of the scholarship will be transferred before the stay abroad.

The approval of the scholarship is linked to the obligation to submit all necessary documents - both before, during and after the stay abroad - on time.

If this is not done, the Hochschule Niederrhein can withhold the scholarship payment or reclaim amounts already paid out.

The remaining scholarship will be paid after submission of all relevant documents and will be based on the actual academic duration of the internship or study programme.

The academic stay at a partner university can include

- 1.) Mandatory quarantine in the host country before the start of studies
- 2.) Welcome day(s)
- 3.) Preparatory language courses
- 4.) Lectures and examinations (in presence)

Stays abroad from the start of the WS 2022/23 academic year:

- *Students and graduates with a disability of GdB 20 or more or a chronic illness
- *Students and graduates travelling abroad with children
- *First-time academics (students from a non-academic background)
- *Employed students
